Math:

We will wrap up Chapter 5 on Monday with our test. We will move into division in the next chapter. We will start off with dividing multiples of 10, 100 and 1000. Please practice multiplication facts at home.

Reading:

"Smokejumpers to the Rescue!" is our story of the week. We will discuss the genre, work with the vocabulary, read the story and then discuss questions about the story. We will wrap up with the comprehension quiz over the story.

Science:

"How do devices like a plug in clock turn on and stay on?" We will update our class consensus model, discuss the "My Growing Ideas", identify evidence and wrap up with a self reflection.

Writing:

The students are working hard on their opinion/argumentative writing. We will work on how to do small group conferencing and then introduce the revision skill.

Spelling:

Social Studies:
